## PART 2: Description

### **St Gregory's memorials inside the church as seen in 2023**

#### Entrance vestibule

In the memory of **George Henry Marchant** for over 65 years a ringer in this church who died November 8<sup>th</sup> 1947 aged 86 years. Ring out the old ring in the new, ring out the false ring in the true.

#### Below Narthex, right side

Sacred to the memory of **Frances Mary the wife of William Hunter** Esq. of Margaret Street, Cavendish Square, London and daughter of Christopher Maling of West Herrington, in the county of Durham Esq. who died in this parish on the 15<sup>th</sup> of September 1805 in the 23<sup>rd</sup> year of her age thus cut off in the early bloom of youth and beauty. She nevertheless lived long enough to practise every virtue which dignifies, adorns and endears the character of her sex in the various offices and relations of humanity, whether domestic duty, or of social benevolence she was a pattern of all that is amiable and engaging and in every action of her life her leading object was the communication of happiness. She supported a long and painful illness with invincible fortitude and the most pious resignation and preserved to the last moment of its fatal termination a cheerful serenity of mind which no sufferings could disturb. Her understanding was comprehensive, her judgement sound, her fancy lively, her taste correct she was liberal in her sentiments, constant in her attachments unbounded in her kindness and she was pre-eminently distinguished for gentleness of temper, simplicity of manners and an innocence of heart. A husband who derived his chief happiness from her society and who in the indelible recollection of her exalted worth, cherishes her memory with the tenderest affection and mourns her loss with the deepest regret, has caused this monument to be erected. Her mortal remains are deposited in a vault in the adjoining churchyard.

Sacred to the memory of **Mary Moore Harrison** eldest daughter of the Revd. William Moore Harrison Rector of Cleyhanger in this county she died on the XVIII [18] of April MDCCCXLV [1845] aged XXI [21]. Deeply regretted by a large circle of relatives and friends. "I love them that love me; and those that seek me early shall find me" Pro. VIII. 17. Also in affectionate memory of **Irene Moore Harrison** sister of the above named Revd. William Moore Harrison who died at Dawlish September 7<sup>th</sup> 1878 aged 78.

In loving memory of **Frederick Stephen Church** second son of Frederick Church R.N. And Emma his wife born December 18<sup>th</sup> 1857, died February 12<sup>th</sup> 1904.

Sacred to the memory of **Sarah the beloved wife of Robert Long** Esq. Of the Manor House, Dawlish who exchanged time for eternity at Cheltenham on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of May, in the year of our Lord 1837. Also in remembrance of **Robert Long** Esq. Who departed this changeful life at Leamington on the 13<sup>th</sup> of December 1842. Their mortal remains are interred in a vault at Swindon near Cheltenham. In the fullness of years they resigned their souls till the joyful resurrection, humbly relying on the promises of their saviour and redeemer. "Inseparable in life in death they are not divided". This memorial is erected by their sorrowing and only daughter. Sorrows are passed away and in the end is shewn the treasures of immortality.

Sacred to the memory of **George Anson Byron** Esq. Captain in his Majesty's Navy. An officer distinguished for his zeal and gallantry on all occasions, but more particularly in India during the Marhatta War when his active cooperation with the Army, called forth the praises and thanks of Lord Cornwallis, and would doubtless have insured him high professional honours. A severe injury however which he sustained on this particular service prematurely closed his career and after a lingering

illness, brought him to the grave at the age of 35. This tribute of duty and affection is erected by his son Captain Lord Byron R.N.

Sacred to the memory of **Major John Grant** who departed this life December 25<sup>th</sup> 1856 aged 71. This tablet is erected to his memory by his affectionate wife.

#### North wall

In proud remembrance of **Richard Alexander Rooth** Lt. Col. 1<sup>st</sup> Batt. Royal Dublin Fusiliers who laid down his life at the landing of the 29<sup>th</sup> Division on "V" beach Gallipoli 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915 aged 49. "Greater love hath no man than this"

To the memory of **Margaret Weston Churchill** wife of Peter Churchill Esq. and eldest daughter of Richard Inglett Fortescue Esq. of this parish who soon after the birth of her first still-born infant closed a life most highly endeared to all who knew her by an unaffected complacency of manners the immediate result of a pious and benevolent heart. December 1<sup>st</sup> 1785 aged 26. This stone is erected by her truly afflicted husband (the only tribute which affection can now bestow) in sincere testimony of her merit and his regret .

In memory of **Laura Pycroft Beaufoy** youngest daughter of Mark Beaufoy Esq. F.R.S. Late of Bushey Heath Middlesex. Ob. 29<sup>th</sup> March 1829 aged 30 years.

Sacred to the memory of **James Nash**, late of Oakhill in this parish Esq. Who died on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1825 aged 63 years. His active benevolence, his store of useful information, and his great public spirit, made him a very valuable member of society and his loss, a subject of deep regret amongst all his neighbours. Also of **Maria** wife of the above who died at Exeter Oct 30<sup>th</sup> 1852 aged 82, a loving mother and kind friend.

To the blessed memory of **Jemima Margaret Isaacson Peacocke**, the beloved wife of George Peacocke Esquire of this parish. Her pure Spirit has taken it's flight to the Mansions of Peace humbly hoping to experience the unspeakable Joys of Heaven, through the promised Mediation of her Divine Redeemer. Died 5<sup>th</sup> December 1822 Aged 21 Years.

Sacred to the memory of **Lieutenant William Matterface** of the Royal Navy killed while boarding an American Privateer in the Bay of Fayal, one of the Western Islands, September 26<sup>th</sup> 1814, Aged 29 Years. Thus fell at an early age in the service of his country, a man who was universally esteemed in his professional character and whose amiable manners and disposition, will long endear his memory to all who can appreciate departed worth. This monument is erected by his afflicted widow, as the last tribute of affection. 'In the midst of Life we are in Death, of whom may we seek for succour but of thee O LORD.'

#### North transept, west wall

Sacred to the memory **Ann Rain Barker** born at Whitby Feb 18<sup>th</sup> 1816 died at Exeter Sept 24<sup>th</sup> 1833. Proverbs viii.17. I.Thess iv. (?)

In memory of **Charlotte Grant** relict of Charles Grant Esquire (youngest brother of the Right Honourable Sir William Grant Master of the Rolls.) She died at Dawlish December 27<sup>th</sup> 1839 aged 68.

Sacred to the memory of **Robert Willis Blencowe** Esq. of Hayes in the county of Middlesex. He died on the 30<sup>th</sup> July 1842 in the 77<sup>th</sup> year of his age. 'Into thine hand I commit my spirit thou hast redeemed me O Lord God of truth' Ps XXXI.6. Also to the memory of the Revd. **William Moulton**

**Blencowe**, Rector of Shawell in the county of Leicester. He died on the 4<sup>th</sup> of June 1841 in the 58<sup>th</sup> year of his age. 'The Lord hath chastened my soul but he hath not given me over into death' Ps CXVIII.18. 'For through him we both have access by one spirit into the Father.' Ephes. III.18. Also to the memory of **Penelope** widow of Robert Willis Blencowe Esq. and second daughter of Sir George Robinson Bart. She died on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1846 aged 74. THE LORD directed her heart into the love of GOD and into the patient waiting for Christ.

Sacred to the memory of **James Hooper** Esquire, Gentleman of the Chamber to His Honor The Master of the Rolls Usher and Doorkeeper of the Court of Chancery died September 30<sup>th</sup> 1834 aged 70

'She Being Dead Yet Speaketh'. To the Memory of **Anne Elizabeth Blencowe**, third daughter of Robert Willis Blencowe Esquire of Hayes Middlesex: She Died June 11<sup>th</sup> 1833 Aged 30 years. Her example will never be forgotten by those who witnessed the resignations, with which, through faith in a saviour, she bore her long and severe sufferings, in her, firmness of principle, and warmth, of affection where combined with kindest, gentlest and most endearing manners.

'My Lord and my God'. To the memory of **Caroline Diana Blencowe**, daughter of Robert Willis Blencowe Esq. of Hayes, Middlesex who died December 18<sup>th</sup> 1861 aged 60 years. Also to the memory of **Margaret Anna Blencowe** widow of the Revd. William Multon Blencowe who died September 1<sup>st</sup> 1849 aged 42 years. 'Jesus Christ the same yesterday and today and forever'.

'What I do thou knowest not now, but thou shalt know hereafter' ( John xiii 7). Sacred to the memory of **Louisa Isabella wife of the Reverend James Hamilton Chichester** Rector of Arlington and Loxhore in this County and youngest daughter of Robert Willis Blencowe Esquire of Hayes Middlesex. She left this Church a young beautiful happy bride On the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1832 in the following year she was carried to her last resting place near this tablet after giving birth to a son who survives. She died on 13<sup>th</sup> February aged 21 years to the great grief of her husband and her family. Yet, whilst they deeply mourn concerning her which is asleep, they do not 'sorrow even as others which have no hope' for, as they believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, are they persuaded that her who sleepeth in Jesus will God bring with Him' (i.thess.v.13 and 14)

North transept south wall

In the memory of **Richard Inglett Fortescue** Esquire of Dawlish in the County of Devon who died February 7<sup>th</sup> 1790 Aged 59. Actuated by the unaffected piety of a sincere Christian his life was a constant exercise of the domestic and social virtues, indulgent and affectionate at home, cheerful and conciliating abroad in friendship slowly and active in public and private trusts of confirmed abilities and honour, an able patience and upright magistrate, a trustworthy and experienced arbitrator. He enjoyed thro' Life the love and confidence of his family his friends and his country having

rendered to all the most essential services. He died leaving behind him the well'earned reputation of an amiable and virtuous man. Also to the memory of **Elizabeth Inglett Fortescue** his wife, daughter of Lucy Weston Esquire of this parish who died August 22<sup>nd</sup> 1816 Aged 80 years.

To the memory of **Frances Campbell** died April 27<sup>th</sup> 1870 aged 90. 'Let thy mercy O LORD be upon us according as we hope in thee' ( Ps xxxiii.22)

Sacred to the memory of **John Schank** Esq. Admiral of the Blue Squadron of his Majesty's fleet who by his ability zeal and integrity raised himself to the highest rank in his profession, and closed an honorable life after a service of sixty years on the sixth of February 1823 aged eighty three. Also of **Margaret** his widow who died February 18<sup>th</sup> 1843 aged eighty three.

Sacred to the memory of The Right Honorable **Sir William Grant**, KNT (Late Master of the Rolls) distinguished equally for the ability, integrity and independence, which marked every stage of his professional career, and the depth and variety of legal learning with which he adorned the seat of Justice. He here closed an useful and well spent life in the enjoyment of the calm and dignified repose of honourable age and the consolation of Christian faith and hope. Born 13<sup>th</sup> October 1752, died 25 May 1832.

**Robert Bryan Long** Esq. The only and beloved son of Robert Long Esq, and Sarah his wife of the Manor House in this parish on 13<sup>th</sup> January 1822 AET 24. His remains repose in the vaults beneath the chapel of the Foundling Hospital London. *Latin inscription*

#### Nave north side

Sacred to the memory of **Anne Dalbiac** relict of Charles Dalbiac Esq. Late of Margate and formerly of Hungerford Park in the county of Berks who departed this life on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 1819 in the 74<sup>th</sup> year of her age. Her two sons and daughter caused this stone to be erected – a feeble memorial of her virtues and of their affection.

Sacred to the memory of **Thomas Hodson** Esq. Late of Knapton House in the East Riding of the county of York who departed this life February 26<sup>th</sup> 1817 aged 64 years.

Sacred to the memory of **Matilda Anne Mortimer** second daughter of the late Edward Horlock Mortimer Esq. Of Bellfield House Wiltshire who died at Dawlish February 24<sup>th</sup> 1820 in the 28<sup>th</sup> year of her age. She departed this life in the blissful hope of a resurrection to immortality.

#### Nave south side

In the memory of **Harriett Isabella Octavia Spiers** daughter of Archibald Spiers Esq. of Elderslie who died 13<sup>th</sup> March 1830.

Sacred to the memory of **Robert Chester** born October 6<sup>th</sup> 1800 died September 20<sup>th</sup> 1822 eldest son of Sir Robert & Lady Chester of Bush Hall Hertfordshire.

Near this place are deposited the remains of the Honorable **William Leeson** died October 7<sup>th</sup> 1819 in the 49<sup>th</sup> year of his age. He was 3<sup>rd</sup> son of Joseph first Earl of Milltown of Resborough in Ireland. With fortitude and resignation he bore a long and painful illness and left a deeply affected widow and daughter to lament in him an irreparable loss. By them this tablet is most affectionately erected in his memory.

#### Lady's Chapel windows



To the glory of God and to the loved and honoured memory of the **Rev. Orlando Manley** B.A. Of Trinity College, Cambridge for 15 years Vicar of this parish. This window is dedicated by his parishioners and other friends Feb MDCCCLXXXIV.

To the glory of God and in affectionate remembrance of **John Hearn** who died 17 June 1888 aged 70 years the window above this tablet was erected by his widow and sons.

To the glory of God and in loving memory of **Elizabeth the wife of Sydney Lawford** who fell asleep at Dawlish February 5<sup>th</sup> 1912.

#### Lady's Chapel general

To the glory of God and in memory of **Captain G.A. Browning** and his two sons Kendall and Hamilton the altar rails and prayer desk are given by his wife and sons All Saints Day 1914.

To the glory of God and in loving memory of **Jane Bush Alford** a daily worshipper in this chapel who died 12 Jan 1926.

**Guy Arrot Browning** M.A. Formerly curate of Dawlish, Chaplain and Naval Instructor R.N. Killed in action May 31<sup>st</sup> 1916 in the battle of Jutland on HMS Indefatigable. Son of the late Capt. G. A. Browning R.N. Dulce et decorum est pro patria mori.

Beneath rests the body of **John Trosse**.....who.....born January 6<sup>th</sup> 1619 and dyed January 4<sup>th</sup> 1678 in hope of a blessed resurrection. And also **Francis** his son who dyed December 10<sup>th</sup> An. Dom. 1674. [Davidson records the missing section as: John Trosse late vicar of Dawlish who was born...]

#### South transept

**Ann relict of the late William Nation** Esq. Died at Dawlish 28<sup>th</sup> October 1836 aged 80. This tablet erected to her memory as a token of affectionate esteem by the son of the above named William Nation.

To the memory of **William Nation** of Exeter Esq. who died at Dawlish 1<sup>st</sup> July 1831 aged 68. This tablet is erected as a tribute of sincere respect and affection by his only son.

Sacred to the memory of **Harriett Foster Kennett** widow of Charles Carleton Kennett Esq. who died at Dawlish the 4<sup>th</sup> day of May 1851 aged 58 years. Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God. St Matthew 5<sup>th</sup> chapter 8<sup>th</sup> verse. Also **Ann Frederick Baylay** sister of the above born May 10<sup>th</sup> 1781, died July 8<sup>th</sup> 1858 aged 74 years. Also of **Mary Mervyn Baylay** last surviving sister of the above who died March 27<sup>th</sup> 1871 aged 88.

Sacred to the memory of the **Reverend John Richards Roberts** B.D., late Rector of Rotherfield, Greys, Oxon who departed this life June the XX [20] MDCCCXLIII [1843] aged LXVII [67] universally esteemed thruly beloved and deeply lamented. Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God. Also of **Elizabeth Brown Roberts** his widow who died April 13<sup>th</sup> 1870 aged 84.

To the memory of **Codrington Parr** Esq. Who died (at Stonelands) Novemnberr 15<sup>th</sup> 1853, aged 53 years. Also **Harriett Lydia Parr** wife of the above who died August 15<sup>th</sup> 1869 aged 70 years.

Also **Harriet Codrington** wife of Rear Admiral Joseph Grant Bickford only daughter of the above who died October 13<sup>th</sup> 1881 aged 55 years. **Joseph Grant Bickford** September 6<sup>th</sup> 1886.

To the memory of **Charles Hoare** Esquire of Luscombe and of (Fleet St) London who died on the 14<sup>th</sup> November 1851, aged 84 years. And of Frances Dorothea his wife the daughter of Sir George Robinson, Brnt. of Cranford in Northamptonshire, who died on the 7<sup>th</sup> Dec 1853, aged 84 yrs. And now Lord what is our hope! truly our hope is even in Thee.

South transept window

This window is erected in affectionate remembrance of **HARRIET ELLEN GREENUP** and her sisters 1876

In memory of **RICHARD GREENUP MD** who died at PARAMATTA AUSTRALIA and also to the memory of his brothers **WILLIAM GEORGE FRANK and HENRY**

In loving memory of **Maria Elizabeth Nosworthy** of Newlands, Dawlish widow of William Nosworthy *M.A.* Clerk in Holy Orders, who died 16<sup>th</sup> October 1916 aged 89, and is buried in the Exeter City Cemetery.

South transept west wall

Sacred to the memory of **Lt. Col Robert Jackson** of the Honourable East India Company's service in the Bombay establishment who died July 7<sup>th</sup> 1786 aged 49 years. Also to the memory of **Lt. Gen. Alexander Cosby Jackson** son of the above died at this place January 29<sup>th</sup> 1827 aged 54 years. Thou dreamest near in the day that...upon thee thou...fear not. Lamentations Chap. 3 verse 57. Also to the memory of **Charlotte Jane Emma** relict of the above named Lt. Col. Jackson mother of the above named Lt Gen. Jackson who departed this life in Cheltenham on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1834 aged 78 years.

Sacred to the memory of **Elizabeth eldest daughter of the late Sir James Pennyman** Baronet and sister to Sir William Henry Pennyman Baronet of Ormesby Hall, Cleveland she departed this life Dec 31<sup>st</sup> 1847 deeply lamented by her relatives and friends. Hear what the voice from heaven proclaims for all the pious dead. Sweet is the savour of their names and soft their dying bed.

**Maria daughter of Major and Maria Payne** died March 1<sup>st</sup> 1845

In the midst of life we are in death. To the memory of **Edward Willes Blencowe**, Lieutenant in the 75<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot, Youngest son of Robert Willis Blencowe Esq. of Hayes Middlesex. He was drowned on 29<sup>th</sup> September 1833 in the 25<sup>th</sup> year of his age whilst bathing in the river Keishumma near Graham's Town in Southern Africa. The sorrow expressed by his brother officers on this sad event proves that they appreciated those kind and gentle yet manly qualities on which his family now dwell with fond and mournful recollection, he was indeed tenderly beloved.

**Carolus Robinson** A.M., St Andreae Ecclesiae Cranford in Agro Northamptoniensi. Rector George Robinson Baronetti E. Filiis Septimus Pastor Vigilantissimus Benevolentia Vitae et morum suantate Vere praeditus Orbiit 8 Maii Ann. Dom 1805 Aetat 29. Uxori, Chorus, Omnibus desideratissimus.

In Affectionate Remembrance of a beloved sister this tablet is erected to **Isabella Anne youngest daughter of the Rev. William Villiers Robinson**. She died at Dawlish after a long illness Feb 17<sup>th</sup> 1834 in her 17<sup>th</sup> year. She walked with God and she was not, for God took her.

South wall

This tablet erected by their four children is sacred to the memory of the **Rev. John David Perkins** D.D. 36 years Vicar of the parish, Rector of St Lawrence in the city of Exeter and of Mamhead in this county, eldest son of John Perkins Esq. Of Staines & Teddington in the county of Middlesex and the representative of the family of the same name formerly of Ufton Court in the county of Berks who departed this life September 29<sup>th</sup> 1845 in the 81<sup>st</sup> year of his age. Also of **Bridget Maria Jane** his wife, daughter of Henry Northcote Esq. And granddaughter of Sir Henry Northcote bart. of Pynes in this county who died April 9<sup>th</sup> 1835 aged 72. Their bodies rest near the communion table in this church.

In memory of **William Scholfield** B.A. University College OXON, second son of Wm. Scholfield Esq. Of Sandhall near Howden in the county of York, who died February 15<sup>th</sup> 1823 aged 23.

Sacred to the memory of **Samuel Needham** of Hackney Lane in the county of Derby, Gentleman who paid the Debt of Nature in this parish in the 30<sup>th</sup> year of his age on 19<sup>th</sup> February MDCCXCVII [1797]. He was endowed by nature with a strong mind, a vigorous and manly understanding, possessing at once integrity of principle, firmness of resolution and unshaken fortitude in friendship unvarying; combining with the sterner virtues, the softer graces of urbanity. Reader such was this man, who not withstanding his various virtues met death at an early period, yet met him with the firmness of a Christian full of the hope of a resurrection to immortality.

Near this place lies interred the mortal remains of **Sarah Maunsell** wife of Daniel Maunsell of the City of Limerick Esq. Who departed this life July 4<sup>th</sup> 1801 in the forty first year of her age. A sincere friend, a fond mother, a loving wife and a pious Christian. She was eminently possessed of every female virtue. Great indeed is the loss to her ten children, and deeply is it deplored by her most affectionate husband. It has pleased God to call her hence and it is our duty to submit with resignation to his Divine will.

Near this place are deposited the remains of **Henry Robbins** youngest son of the late Thomas Robbins Esq. and **Anne** his wife formerly of Pilewell House in the county of Southampton who departed this life the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1814 aged 9 years.

Below Narthex left side

In memory of **Frances, third daughter of Henry Boulton** and Ann Pennell of this parish who died at Dawlish February 12<sup>th</sup> 1846 aged 15 years. Also **Charles** their fourth son, who died at Gibraltar August 1857 where he was buried, aged 19 years. Also **Henry-Lee** their eldest son, who died at Bombay May 1<sup>st</sup> 1860 aged 26 years. Also **Ann**, wife of the above Henry Boulton Pennell died January 7<sup>th</sup> 1869 aged 69 years. Also **Henry Boulton Pennell** died March 31<sup>st</sup> 1888 aged 91 years. Also **Emma**, second daughter of the above Henry Boulton Pennell who died August 23<sup>rd</sup> 1892 aged 62. Also **Rebecca**, eldest daughter of the above Henry Boulton Pennell who died December 21<sup>st</sup> 1892 aged 64. Also **Alfred** fifth son of Henry Boulton Pennell who died at Montreal June 13<sup>th</sup> 1894 aged 55.

To the memory of him whose cheerful contentment through life was only equalled by his calm resignation in death, **George Stawell** of Summer Hill Esq. In the county of Cork, Ireland; this tablet is inscribed. As he lived beloved; so he died lamented. In life and death, a sincere friend to the poor. He died May 9<sup>th</sup> 1808, aged 68 years. *“Let me die the death of the righteous and let my last end be like his”*.

Sacred to the memory of **John Edgecumbe Tuke** Esq. Who died November 19<sup>th</sup> 1833 aged 47. Requiescat in pace,

Sacred to the memory of **Harriet the beloved wife of William Nation** Esq. Of Exeter and daughter of Alexander H. Hamilton Esq. Of the Retreat in this county. She departed this life at Budleigh Salterton on the 13<sup>th</sup> of October 1844. Also of the above **William Nation** Esq. Who died at Exeter on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April 1861 aged 70 years. "Looking unto Jesus" Heb. 12.2. In loving memory of **Helen Charlotte** daughter of the above W. Nation who departed this life December 14<sup>th</sup> 1873 aged 24. "Written among the living" Is. 4.3. Also **Mary Jane** wife of above died April 1897 and **William Hamilton Codrington** son of above William Nation died March 1914.

**Elizabeth Lady Pennyman**, daughter of Sir Henry Grey Bart. Of Howick in the county of Northumberland, died March the 30<sup>th</sup> 1801, aged 60 years. "Blessed are the dead, which die in the Lord: even so saith the spirit, for they rest from their labours". Erected in memory of a beloved mother by her four daughters.
